Welcome back to Nursery. It is wonde see the children come back after the E break. They are now preparing for their journey through to Reception and are becoming independent learners. Please continue to check Parent Hub for updates

We are learning about animals during this half term. We will look at farm and jungle animals through the stories of Handa's Surprise and the Little Red Hen. We will be learning how to look after books and how to use them properly. We have introduced a writing area this term so are looking forward to seeing lots of the children's writing and pictures.

Our role-play area has become a farm shop; why not ask your child to help you write a shopping list at home? Finally, we will be doing lots of follow-up work from our visit to the farm and are hoping to get a visit from some of Miss Beck's pets!





Once again we have updated the collection of books that you and your child can take home; these are in the cloakroom. Please take one book at a time and remember to return the books once you have finished with them. Thank you to the parents who have attended

School shoes or **plain** black trainers must be worn arrive at Nursery. We have wellingtons available


for the children to use when playing outdoors. Please help your child

It is important that children arrive to nursery on time as coming late affects their education and their attendance! If you arrive after this time, please go to the school office to inform school that your child is present.

Please remember that we are unable to send a child home with any children under **16** due to safeguarding procedures.

We will be reading The Little Red Hen to introduce our topic: this is a simple story about a hen collecting the ingredients and making some bread. During our Literacy sessions we will be focussing on recognising text, understanding that it carries meaning and learning how to 'read' books carefully. There is a lot of repeated text in the Little Red Hen so we are going to practise joining in with this during story time.

We will also read Rosie's Walk which is a story about Rosie, who walks across a farm yard. This is a brilliant learning opportunity for children to learn and use postiional language. Please encourage your children to use positional language at home.

Helping your child at home

Please ask your child about what they have been doing at Nursery, encouraging them to speak in sentences. This term we are developing a 'things you can do at home board.' Please use this board for

examples of things that you could do with your child at home. Please let us know how it has gone at home. We would love to see writing, pictures or photographs!
