

Year 5 Newsletter

What we will be learning about this term in Maths and English.

In <u>English</u> lessons this half term, children will be focusing on the poem 'The Highwayman' where we will be looking at characterisation and exploring the poem in depth. We will be working on our descriptive writing; focusing on similes and metaphors.



Each week children will also have a spelling, punctuation and grammar lesson.

In Year 5, we expect the children to achieve at least 80% in their weekly spelling tests so it is important that the children have the opportunity to practise their spellings at home.

In <u>Mathematics</u> this half term, children will be learning how to plot co-ordinates, translate and reflect shapes in four quadrants. We will also be extending our multiplication and division skills incorporating money problems.

Please practise times table multiplication and division facts with your child as it is extremely important that they are confident in this area .

Please ensure your children are using their

mental maths skills effectively in everyday contexts e.g. calculating money when shopping, telling the time and finding the differences in timetables as well as converting units of measurement when cooking or travelling.

Copthorne Curriculum

In Copthorne curriculum, our new topic is called 'Arabian Nights'. It focusses on the early Islamic civilisation and how it has impacted on modern day. We will



be looking at Islamic art and architecture and creating our own geometric designs. We will also be looking at the signification of Baghdad in the development of the Islamic civilisation.

In <u>Religious Education</u> we will be learning all about Special People. This will include influential figures in and out of religion who have been influential in their own right.

In **PSHCE** we are focusing on Picture News. Picture News has a different theme each week. The themes are influenced by events around the world and current news extracts that can be used as discussion points in relation to British Values.

In Year 5, it is expected that children access **'Mathletics'** at home frequently, ideally everyday for a minimum of <u>20 minutes</u>. We will be regularly updating activities for your child to complete and allowing to children to 'Play Live'.

<u>Remember</u> there's always a possibility you could be one



of the top 10 world Mathletes and earn your position on the leader board.
