What we will be learning about this term in Maths and English.


In **English** lessons this half term, children will be focusing on Oranges In No Mans Land. We will mainly be focusing on characters, settings and writing a play script based on the story.

Each week children will also have a grammar and spelling lesson. In Year 5 we expect the children to achieve at least 80% in their weekly spelling tests so it is important that the children have the opportunity to practise their spellings at home.

In **Mathematics** this half term, children will be looking at fractions on a deeper level, looking at properties of 3D shapes and converting metric to imperial measures.

Please practise times table multiplication and division facts with your child as it is extremely important that they are confident in this area.

Please ensure your children are using their mental maths skills effectively in everyday contexts e.g. calculating money when shopping, telling the time and finding the differences in timetables, converting units of measurement when cooking or travelling.

 Is often set for homework activities. Please ask your child to show you this and discuss what they are learning with them. They have all received their own username, password and school code to access this resource. If your child cannot access the internet at home please let us know and we will make arrangements in school for them to complete their online homework.
