What will we be doing this half term?

During our **English** lessons we are learning how to write instructions and we are writing our own version of 'The Gingerbread Man'.

In Maths we will be beginning to learn about shape and developing our measuring skills. We will continue to practice our addition and subtraction skills as well.

Our **Copthorne Curriculum** theme this half term is 'Fire! Fire!' where we will be learning about the Great Fire of London.

In History we will include looking at the events of the Great Fire of London, why it happened and what happened after the fire.

In Computing we will be using our typing and drawing skills to create posters.

We will be creating a gymnastics sequence using the apparatus in **PE** lessons.

In our **DT** lessons we will be learning to sew material to create bunting. In Science lessons we are learning all about materials and their properties.
