We request that children continue to read and complete their Raving Readers activities. Please also encourage your children to complete Mathletics, SPAG.com and Bug Club homework which is provided for them weekly.

During our English lessons we are focusing our learning on persuasive speech and report writing for the theme 'Pupil Parliament', where children will be able to voice their opinion on issues concerning our school through a news report. We will be reading and analysing reports and using techniques used in persuasive writing to film a news report for Copthorne News.

We will continue to work on children's knowledge of spelling, punctuation and grammar by developing their understanding of how to use and differentiate between direct and indirect speech. They will also continue to build on previously developed skills such as fronted adverbials, prepositions and compound and complex sentences in their writing.

In Science, children will be learning about sound, focusing on how sound is made and how we can hear sounds.

During Maths lessons, we will focus on developing children's knowledge of shape, space and measures. Please support your children by involving them in practical tasks involving measure, such as checking the time or cooking.

In Music, children will continue to learn to play the ukulele.

In PE, children will be learning dance and netball.
