Welcome back!

We hope you all had a pleasant break. The new academic year has got off to a great start, and we would like to thank you for making sure all children are wearing the correct uniform, and have come to school ready to learn. We request that children have their Raving Readers books in school each day so that we keep our reward charts up to date and get prizes awarded as soon as possible. This includes the activities in the Raving Reader books, which need to be completed in of their homework books. Mathletics, Spag.com and Bug Club activities are updated weekly and we ask that you support and encourage your children to complete these.

During our **English** lessons, we are focussing our learning on a range of folklore tales taken from, 'The Story Collector, The Lion and the Unicorn and Other Hairy Tales' by Jane Ray. Through this unit, we will inspire children to become effective storytellers. Children will engage with a range of stories, explore themes and issues, and develop and sustain ideas through discussion. We will also develop creative responses to the text through drama, storytelling and artwork. These tales will be used by the children to compose a range of texts such as; letter writing, persuasive writing, creative writing and story writing. We will continue to work on children's knowledge of spelling, punctuation and grammar by developing their understanding of how to use a range of compound and complex sentences in their writing.

During <u>Maths</u> lessons, we will focus on developing children's knowledge of place value and the four operations. Please support your children with their learning at home by using Mathletics.

As <u>Scientists</u> we will be learning about the importance of light in helping us to see things and that dark is the absence of light.

In indoor <u>PE</u>, we will be practising and developing our gymnastic skills. During outdoor sessions, we will be learning to play football.
