Welcome back!

We hope you all had a pleasant break. The new half term has got off to a great start, and we would like to thank you for making sure all children are wearing the correct uniform, and have come to school ready to learn.

We request that children have their Raving Reader books in school each day so that we keep our reward charts up to date and get prizes awarded as soon as possible. It is essential that you read with your child every night to aid their progress in English and to develop their love of reading. Mathletics, Spag.com and Bug Club activities are updated weekly and we ask that you support and ensure your child completes these.

During our <u>English</u> lessons, we will be continuing with our 'Myths and Legends' theme and using this to inspire the following types of writing; a fictional biography (based on a legendry hero) and a non-chronological report (based on mythical beast). Through our fictional biography unit, we will develop an understanding of chronology, writing in third person, using the past tense and how fronted adverbials aid the sequencing of our biography. During our non-chronological report unit we will develop an understanding of using paragraphs to sequence our ideas, writing in the present tense and including similes to describe our mythical beasts in great detail.

During <u>Maths</u> lessons, we will focus on developing children's knowledge on multiplying and dividing using a formal written method. It is essential that your child practices their 2, 3, 4, 5, 8 and 10 times tables to support them in their learning.

As <u>Scientists</u> we will be focusing on human and animal skeletons and muscles and the effects exercise and dietary choices have on our bodies.

In \underline{PE} , we are practising and developing our athletics skills for indoor PE, by learning key skills such as running, sprinting, throwing and catching. During outdoor sessions, we will be learning to follow the rules of Hockey and play fairly by passing the ball to team members at appropriate times.
