

# Year 6 Creative Curriculum

## Theme: Conflict

### Areas of Learning

As **Historians**, we will investigate and interpret the past using a range of sources of evidence to deduce information about WWI and WWII and justify claims. We will describe the main changes during this time and also develop an awareness of propaganda and social contexts during this time.

As **geographers**, we will identify and locate different countries, which took part in WWI and WWII and the location of the countries in relation to each other and the impact this had on the wars. We will also look at the characteristics of these countries.

We will explore the diversity of people who took part in the World Wars, the acceptance of diversity, and the people who fought for England. We will also look at Remembrance Day and how the wars shaped the future and world in which we live in today.	We will explore the well-being of those who took part in the war and the impact that the war had on people's well-being after the war. We will also consider what is positive for our well-being in class and use and apply these strategies when learning alongside of each other.	We will explore the use of propaganda and the media during the World Wars and how it was used. We will then create our own examples of propaganda to promote and idea.	We will visit the Industrial Museum and experience a WWII classroom and the educational experience of child evacuee and their learning environment during this time. We will also explore a range of primary sources and artefacts to develop our historical inquiry.



As **artists**, we will analyse a range of examples of propaganda, considering the messages that they are trying to convey and the colour and illustration used and the impact that it has. We will use and apply drawing and painting skills to create a poster demonstrating propaganda for the media during WWII.



During **Religious Education**, we will explore different religions and the role that they played during the World Wars.
