She meets regularly with the Head of School and other senior leaders to discuss key actions linked to Investors in Pupils.



Everyone in the class works together to agree targets and everyone can talk about what the targets are and why they have been chosen.


Rewards for achieving Targets

Adult Achievements





Financial responsibility



All classes are allocated a class budget to buy resources.

Pupils learn about the costs of resources that are needed to help them learn e.g. pencils and rulers etc.

They understand that they have a responsibility to take care of the resources and they consider ways that they can reduce waste.

Financial Knowledge


