Developing a deeper understanding of what a forest is through the core story.	Children are building on from A1 by understanding their own identity. We are linking to family celebrations and British celebrations. Repetitive story — developing on Sapling's 'Journeys'.	Develop a wider range of occupations from Saplings. Little Red Hen to establish an understanding of team work and sharing.	Revisiting prior learning of animal sounds and names. Research a wider variety of animals, and compare the characteristics of them.	Introducing children to different fruit and vegetables to enable them to talk about what they are eating at snack time. Comparing environments building upon work in A2 and preparing for Reception topics where they look at different environments.
